Respect means we celebrate Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples' strong connection to the land, water, and sea.




Elders know a lot about culture and history and are very important to the community.

This plan is from the Victorian Electoral Commission.




We help people in Victoria vote.




We wrote this plan to tell you about how we want to make things better for Aboriginal people in Victoria.

About the Victorian Electoral Commission



We hold local council elections and state elections in Victoria. Elections are where people vote.



When you vote, you help choose who is part of government.




In Australia, people get to vote because everyone is part of a democracy. This means you get to help decide how things happen.



We also do other important activities, like:

- keep a list of all the people who vote in elections in Victoria
- help people in Victoria know how, when, and where to vote
- make sure people follow the law during an election.



Politicians are the people in government.



We care about the work we do. We make sure we improve what we do for the community.



To improve, we work with 5 groups that represent people who might need extra help to be part of our democracy.

The 5 groups we work with are:

- the Aboriginal Advisory Group
- the Electoral Access Advisory Group
- the Prisons and Without a Home Advisory Group
- the Young People Advisory Group
- the Culturally and Linguistically Diverse Advisory Group.




These groups help us understand what people need and want.

How we made our plan



To make our plan, we talked to Aboriginal people for 3 years.



We also learned about Aboriginal culture. For example, we worked with Aboriginal leaders in the community.



Aboriginal leaders helped us learn about what we needed to put in our plan.



We looked at other plans about Aboriginal self-determination.



These plans told us about important things we should do, like:

- respect Aboriginal culture
- make sure Aboriginal people have self-determination
- understand the trauma that Aboriginal people have had in the past.



Trauma is when you experience something that harms your mental health for a long time afterwards.



Feedback is when people tell us what they think about a topic.



We got feedback about the problems Aboriginal people might have.




We learnt new things from the feedback.

What we want to make better



We want to make sure Aboriginal people in Victoria have self-determination.



Self-determination means people have the right to make their own decisions about their future.



We want to respect the history and culture of Aboriginal people in Victoria.



We want Aboriginal people to trust how elections are done.



We want everyone to be included. For example, we want everyone to learn about how an election happens and how they can vote.



We also want to give support to make sure everyone is a part of our democracy.


How we will make things better



We have some goals to make things better.

The goals of our plan are to:

- make sure our workplace supports
 Aboriginal self-determination
- learn more about Aboriginal and Torres
 Strait Islander cultures
- give Aboriginal people better information about elections
- give Aboriginal people more support to be part of elections.





We have 3 things we want to focus

on to get our goals done:

- cultural safety
- community, capability, and connection
- cultural competency and representation.



Cultural safety

This means people from all cultures are treated equal and feel respected.

To respect and celebrate Aboriginal cultures, we will include it when we make things. For example, information documents.



We will make it easier for Aboriginal people to take part in elections. For example, we might organise for people to vote at Aboriginal service centres.

Community, capability, and connection



This means supporting people to work together, learn skills and feel included.



We will make sure people in Aboriginal communities get better information about democracy.



We will work with Aboriginal groups to make leadership programs.



Leadership is when people or groups work together to make goals happen.



We will also run cultural and community events.



Cultural competency and representation

This means people who are not Aboriginal learn about Aboriginal cultures.



It is also when Aboriginal workers and community members get choices about things that are important to them.



We will talk with Aboriginal leaders.



We will support the Aboriginal Advisory Group.



We will find ways to support our Aboriginal workers.



We will include Aboriginal people in decisions. For example, we will make sure they help us decide about Aboriginal services and policies.



We will give our workers training to understand more about Aboriginal cultures.



We will also make sure we have leaders that are Aboriginal and that represent Aboriginal people.

How we will know if our plan is working




We will know our plan is working if more Aboriginal people:

We will know more about how our plan is working when we get more information about Aboriginal people.




Every year we will make a report about how our plan is working.
