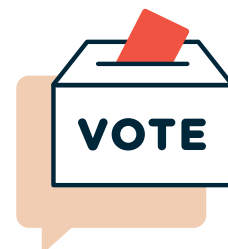


Voting at the 2026 state election



Step 1 Before voting

- Think about who you want to vote for
- Decide where you will vote, find out how to get there
- Practice how to complete a ballot paper
- Bring a document with your name and address if you want to — this can help you give your details

Step 2 At the voting centre

Our staff will ask you 3 questions:

1. What is your full name?
2. What is your address?
3. Have you voted before in this election?

The staff will then give you 2 ballot papers.
They will show you how to complete them.

You can ask questions. You can also bring:

- a support person
- notes
- mobility aids
- communication tools

Step 3 How to vote

1. Get your ballot papers from the staff
2. Complete the ballot papers the way you practiced
3. Put the papers in the ballot box
4. You've voted!

Accessible voting options

We have different ways to vote. You can access:

- wheelchair accessible voting centres
- telephone assisted voting
- early voting centres
- postal voting
- low-sensory voting

We are here to help

On voting day, our staff can help you:

- get around the voting centre
- with large print ballot papers
- with a quiet or accessible space to vote if it's available
