Country is the land we work on.




We celebrate Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples' important role in the community.

Respect means we celebrate Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples' strong connection to the land, water, and sea.




Elders know a lot about culture and history and are very important to the community.

- your religion.



About the Victorian **Electoral Commission**



We hold local council elections and state elections in Victoria. Elections are where people vote.



When you vote, you help choose who is part of government.



In Australia, people get to vote because everyone is part of a democracy. This means you get to help decide how things happen.



We also do other important activities, like:

- keep a list of all the people who vote in elections in Victoria
- help people in Victoria know how, when, and where to vote
- make sure people follow the law during an election.



We care about the work we do.

We make sure we improve what
we do for the community.



To improve, we work with 5 groups that represent people who might need extra help to be part of our democracy.

The 5 groups we work with are:

- the Aboriginal Advisory Group
- the Electoral Access Advisory Group
- the Prisons and Without a Home
 Advisory Group
- the Young People Advisory Group
- the Culturally and Linguistically Diverse
 Advisory Group.



These groups help us understand what people need and want.

How we made our plan



To make our plan, we looked at 2 other plans.



One of the plans we looked at talks about changes we must make because of changes outside our workplace.



The other plan we looked at talks about how we want to make our workplace more inclusive, accessible and diverse.



Inclusive means everyone is welcome and can take part.



Accessible means everyone can use something or go somewhere.



Diverse means people are different from each other.



We also worked with a group of people with different cultural backgrounds in the community.



Feedback is when people tell us what they think about a topic.



We got feedback about the problems people with different cultural backgrounds might have. We learnt new things from the feedback.

What we want to make better



We want people from all cultural backgrounds to trust how elections are done.



We want everyone to be included. For example, we want everyone to learn about how an election happens and how they can vote.



We also want to give support to make sure everyone is a part of our democracy.

How we will make things better



We have some goals to make things better.



We have 3 things we want to focus on to get our goals done:

- access
- knowledge and confidence
- relationships, visibility, and representation.



Access

We want to make sure people from all cultural backgrounds can access our services.



We will:

- understand who to help and where to help
- find ways to help people take part in elections
- make things about elections in different languages, like enrolment forms and videos.

Knowledge and confidence



We want to make sure people from all cultural backgrounds understand about democracy and know how to take part in elections.



We will hire workers from different cultural backgrounds.



Workers will run lessons about democracy in different languages.



Relationships, visibility, and representation

We will keep working with groups that represent people from different cultural backgrounds.

We will also:

- go to events for people from different cultural backgrounds
- support services that help people from different cultural backgrounds
- show people from different cultural backgrounds in our work, like information documents.

How we will know if our plan is working



We will know if our plan is working if more people from all cultural backgrounds:

- know how to enrol to vote
- know how to vote or get help to vote
- help others take part in elections.




Every year we will make a report about how our plan is working.
