

What happens if I do not vote?

Apparent Failure to Vote Notice

We will send you a letter called an **Apparent Failure to**Vote Notice.



This is a letter saying we think you did not vote.

If you get this letter you must write back.



You can ask someone you trust to help you.



If you **did** vote tick the option that says you did



and write about when and where you voted or posted your vote

or



if you did **not** vote tick the option that says you did not vote




and write about why you did not vote.

If at the time of the election you:




didn't have a place to live



• were in prison, or



were experiencing serious mental illness

Return your letter to the VEC

you can email us your letter

or



post the letter back to us

you do not need a stamp.



Infringement Notice (a fine)

If you do not answer the first letter

or



you do not give us a good reason for why you did not vote



we may send you another letter called an **Infringement Notice.**



This is a fine for not voting in an election.

The fine for not voting is \$92

for elections held after 1 July 2022.

You must respond by the due date.

How to respond to the letter

You can:



pay a fine



ask to pay your fine in parts over time



ask for a review



• choose to go to court

How to pay a fine



The **Infringement Notice (fine)** will list all the payment options.

You can pay:



by Post Billpay at any Australia Post outlet



using BPAY phone or internet banking



 posting a bank cheque or money order to the VEC using the reply-paid number shown on your notice.

Do not ignore your fine.



If you do not pay your fine or respond by the due date you will have to pay more money.


